Amendments have been made to the suite of General, Applied (Essential), Short Course 2025 and General (Extension) 2026 v1.1 syllabuses and Literacy and Numeracy 2025 v1.0 syllabuses. These amendments include minor corrections in response to stakeholder feedback. These syllabuses have now been published as v1.2 (and v1.1 for Literacy and Numeracy).
